Harriet Tubman is the namesake for the AHG Pioneer Level Award, a special recognition earned by girls ages 15-18 signifying their dedication to the AHG Program. Harriet Tubman stands as an example of needs recognition and sacrifice of time and resources to make a better life for others—a role model of bravery and confidence.

American Heritage Girls recognizes that prayer is the first line of defense in times of trouble. As the U.S., and the world, approaches the one-year mark of struggling with the COVID-19 pandemic and celebrates Women's History Month, *AHG* continues to pray for girls everywhere, that they would witness God's goodness, despite difficulty in our world, and

experience the joy that is living a life for Christ. Godly role models play a strong part in helping girls have a vision for the future by knowing what outcomes were of heroes in the past.
