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## ***American Heritage Girls teaches leaders conflict resolution skills at AHGequip Spark seminar***

*Virtual discussion gives leaders the tools to apply biblical conflict resolution within Troops*

CINCINNATI, Ohio — Countless families from coast to coast know that *American Heritage Girls (AHG, [www.americanheritagegirls.org](http://www.americanheritagegirls.org))* is the premier faith-based, scout-type leadership development program for girls and young women ages five to 18 in the U.S. *AHG* offers hands-on badge programs, service projects, leadership opportunities, outdoor adventures, and much more. It emphasizes Christian values and family participation, and its leaders receive superior training that is recognized as a hallmark for adult volunteers.

During the pandemic, *AHG* found new ways to innovate in order to keep its Troops and volunteers connected. When the in-person *AHGequip* training seminars had to be canceled, *AHG* pivoted and created exciting virtual opportunities for its leaders around the country. It incorporated a digital conference platform that allowed participants to view live presentations and interact with other participating leaders from their own homes.

***Said AHG Founder and Executive Director Patti Garibay, “Our AHG leaders so enjoyed their virtual time together—learning and building community—that we created quarterly sessions to keep the ‘spark’ going! These virtual sessions, which focus on a single key topic—allowing us to do a deep dive during our time together—are free to all AHG Adult Members.”***

The next *AHGequip* Spark seminar will be held on February 16, 2022. The event will be focused on biblical conflict resolution within Troops.

***“No one likes conflict, but it’s a reality we all face in today’s world more than ever before, even while serving in ministry,” Garibay commented. “That’s why the upcoming AHGequip virtual Spark seminar will focus on how to apply biblical conflict resolution within Troop leadership, as well as shepherding girls well in handling conflict resolution.”***

This gives *AHG* girls the important social experience of interacting with friends and godly mentors of various ages; members also learn leadership skills within a group setting. *AHG* Troops are located in [local communities](#) across the nation. If none exists in a given area, families can bring the *AHG* Program to their own area. Thousands of volunteer members across the country are helping girls grow in their faith, cultivate a heart for service, enjoy the great outdoors, and have more fun than they can imagine.
