Patti Garibay: 'Fear, worry, and anxiety are part of the human condition, but as part of the Body of Christ we are called to faith over fear'

CINCINNATI, Ohio — Young girls are in trouble. A recent <u>Center for Disease Control (CDC) report</u> revealed that 57 percent of high school females reported feeling sadness or hopelessness in 2021, a 58 percent increase from 36 percent in 2011. Additionally, 30 percent of girls seriously considered attempting suicide in 2021, an almost 60 percent increase from 19 percent in 2011.

"We live in a troubling world, and despite parents' best efforts, children can often feel the pressures of modern society," said American Heritage Girls (AHG, www.americanheritagegirls.org) Founder and Executive Director Patti Garibay. "As our culture continually moves away from Christ — the author and provider of peace and prosperity — it makes perfect sense that our girls feel the effects of a life without the Lord."

In order to equip adults with biblical truths to deal with girls' stress, *American Heritage Girls* offers "A Raising Godly Girls Guide to Tackling 8 Stressors that Girls Face Today." Garibay explained, "Today's teens are experiencing the effects of worry and fear in unprecedented numbers. Diagnostic interview data from the National Comorbidity Survey Adolescent Supplement shows that 31% of all youth have diagnosed anxiety disorders. Note the word 'diagnosed.' Imagine the percentage when we include those who have not sought medical or psychiatric help."

In the face of a national mental health crisis affecting girls, *AHG* shines a bright light on the power of faith and fellowship in the midst of such a bleak outlook for America's girls. *AHG*, one of the largest Christian, scouttype organizations in the world, has been providing powerful, Christ-focused programming to help girls develop leadership skills, build relationships, and get outdoors for almost 30 years.
