The sense of empowerment that girls get through outdoor activities is overwhelming. High adventure activity programming teaches girls that there are no limits on what they can achieve, despite the common narrative of female meekness. It also teaches girls that their abilities come from somewhere, or more specifically Someone greater than themselves."

**AHG** provides a balanced program, which progresses with the girl, increasing in challenge and skill as she grows in maturity and knowledge. **AHG** is committed to not rushing a girl through girlhood and allowing her the time to grow and learn who she is and whose she is in Christ.

"It can sometimes be challenging to see the goodness of God in our day-to-day lives," Garibay continued. "It is so important to remind girls that God is good all the time, and that all that is good comes from God alone. As our good and perfect heavenly Father, God wants us to turn to Him for answers, hope, and life.

"When girls immerse themselves in nature — God's creation — the reality of His almighty power and call for each human heart becomes clear. Involving girls wholly in nature and testing their skills with a variety of outdoor adventures that challenge and help them grow in confidence is important to building strong, competent young women. With the aid of such programming, God gifts girls with self-awareness and leadership qualities, allowing them to blossom in a healthy and encouraging environment. And, in the case of AHG, adding the Christ-centered mentorship of our leaders and program enhances the spiritual development of each girl."

American Heritage Girls was founded in 1995 when Founder and Executive Director Patti Garibay became concerned with the direction the Girl Scouts of America was headed. Garibay, along with a group of concerned parents, wanted a faith-based, scout-type character development program for their daughters, and American Heritage Girls was born. Today, there are Troops in all 50 states and girls being served in 15 countries around the globe. Thousands of volunteer members across the country are helping girls grow in their faith, cultivate a heart for service, enjoy the great outdoors, and have more fun than they can imagine.

At *AHG*, girls ages five to 18 meet together as <u>a single Troop</u> at the same time and then break out into Units by Levels. This gives *AHG* girls the important social experience of interacting with friends and godly mentors of various ages; members also learn leadership skills within a group setting. *AHG* Troops are located in <u>local communities</u> across the nation.
