American Heritage Girls instills sanctity of life in girls, no matter the age or the stage

CINCINNATI, Ohio — As America celebrates the first anniversary of <u>Dobbs v. Jackson</u>, the Supreme Court ruling that overturned *Roe v. Wade*, *American Heritage Girls* (*AHG*, <u>www.americanheritagegirls.org</u>) — one of the largest Christian, scout-type organizations in the world — is renewing its dedication to raising godly girls who understand the value of human life.

"We live in a day and age where life, in all of its ages and stages, is taken for granted," said AHG Founder and Executive Director Patti Garibay. "More than ever before, it is vital to defend the right to life. Even after the Supreme Court ruling in <u>Dobbs v. Jackson</u> last year that determined that abortion 'rights' go back to the state level, the fight for the unborn is not done. We as Christians are called to be light in the darkness of the world."

AHG members can earn a Respect Life Patch or Pin if they participate in any event that brings attention to respecting life, or by providing service to an organization whose mission or purpose demonstrates a desire to respect life, such as pregnancy centers, pro-life groups and hospices. Activities like these are designed to teach girls the importance of respecting life at any age or any stage.

"In a world that places so little value on human life, we at AHG know that each and every girl was designed specifically by a thoughtful Creator. Our new 2023-2024 program theme, 'WOVEN,' helps girls learn how intricately God shaped their identities so that they better understand His purpose and plan for their lives. If we understand how much care and concern went into every single living creature on the planet, the logical response is a respect for life — and the One who created it all," concluded Garibay.

Garibay challenged parents and guardians: "While you do your part to stand firmly for life, what are you doing to instill these same values in your daughter? Just think: how many times has your daughter been part of a conversation about life issues? Is she hearing a consistent and convicting pro-life message? It is crucial that your family confront this issue at home.

"Start the conversation reminiscing on the precious time she was being knit in the womb. If you can, share ultrasound photographs or memories of hearing her heartbeat for the very first time. If your family celebrates an adoption story, share how God's hand orchestrated it all. Visit the elderly together. Care for the sick in your community. Showing her the value of humankind, while having conversations about how precious all life is, will get the ball rolling."

American Heritage Girls was founded in 1995 when Founder and Executive Director Patti Garibay became concerned with the direction the Girl Scouts of America was headed. Garibay, along with a group of concerned parents, wanted a faith-based, scout-type character development program for their daughters, and American Heritage Girls was born. Today, there are Troops in all 50 states and girls being served in 15 countries around the globe. Thousands of volunteer members across the country are helping girls grow in their faith, cultivate a heart for service, enjoy the great outdoors, and have more fun than they can imagine.

At *AHG*, girls ages five to 18 meet together as <u>a single Troop</u> at the same time and then break out into Units by Levels. This gives *AHG* girls the important social experience of interacting with friends and godly mentors of various ages; members also learn leadership skills within a group setting. *AHG* Troops are located in <u>local</u> <u>communities</u> across the nation.
